

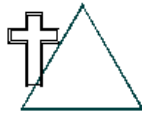

The Pastor’s Prism

Greater Access for Others and God



For some years our congregation has worked to make our church and parish house more accessible to those who have mobility issues. Monies set aside over the years from events like Strawberry Festivals and Christmas Bazaars, and there have been memorials and offerings specified to help fund the needed adjustments to make our facilities more accessible.

The first project was to improve access to the church, which was done through the building of a properly inclined concrete walkway, with railings, from the driveway to the sacristy door. Some years later an Americans Disability Act (ADA) compliant rest room was built in the nursery of the church. These improvements made it possible for those who depended on wheel chairs to readily access the church and have the support they needed in order to participate in worship services.

Last year, because we only had rest rooms in the basement of the Parish House, an ADA compliant rest room was installed upstairs next to the stage in the auditorium. The most recent phase has been the building of an ADA ramp and door to the Parish House auditorium.

A special thanks goes to Gary Meadows of Meadows Home Improvement who also chairs our Property Committee for his taking on the leadership for all these accessibility issues and doing practically all the planning and implementation of these efforts over the years. We admire the quality of workmanship that characterizes all his work so evident in what he has done for the church and parish house!

While our church has been ADA compliant for some years, now our parish house will be ADA compliant as well.

This will allow it to be used for wider use for community groups and others. In the past some groups who wanted to use our parish house rejected using it because we were inaccessible to those who had mobility issues.

We are also greatly appreciative of all those who have given support for these efforts over the years by their contributions, ideas, and assistance. Furthermore, I have been encouraged by the dogged determinism and focus by many over the years so that our facilities would be more accessible to those with special needs. If you strongly believe in and see the value of something, you will support it!

Wouldn’t it be great if we could take this determinism and focus with accessibility concerns and apply in the care of ourselves? While it is true that much attention is given by some to getting and keeping their bodies in shape through diet programs and exercise regimes, what about spiritual care? What might happen if we used the same kind of dogged determinism and focus that we used in making our facilities more accessible and in our self-care in trying to know God’s will for us each day? Such an orientation could lead to a more integrated and fulfilling life because we would be doing our best in responding to His Presence in our lives. Such a focus would make us realize that our lives with God are more than simply participating in Sunday worship. Daily prayer and Bible reading would become an essential part of our lives so that we could more fully be His people for the world.

We don’t have to build anything to access God because He is always accessible to us and has provided for the means for us to know His will through

His Word, prayer, and sensing when He might be speaking to us through others. Focusing on the spiritual care of our lives as well as our physical and mental care we could join with the psalmist (86:11-12) who wrote, **“Teach me Your way (will), O LORD, that I may walk in Your truth; give me an undivided heart to revere Your Name. I give thanks to You, O Lord, my God with my whole heart, and I will glorify Your Name forever.”**

As we have made the church and parish house more accessible for those with special needs, let us open our hearts and wills to the God Who constantly wants to access us with His grace, which we show in our faithfulness and loyalty to Him.

Missionary Notes

Eric and Wendolyn are ELCA missionaries whom we at St. Mary's help support. They serve the Ecumenical Seminary, Sabah, Malaysia.

Hello friends at congregations,
Apa khabar? Sudah makan? (What's the news? Have you eaten yet?)

This isn't the fun kind of missionary letter to be sending to congregations and those who have been supporting us in prayer. Aside from this health issue, things are really exciting here in Malaysia and at the seminary, and when we get around to our quarterly newsletter, you'll get to hear far better news than this! I'm writing to let you know our latest update on my treatment of the breast cancer discovered in August. The short version is this:

- The first surgery got all of the invasive cancer out but there is still non-invasive or pre-cancer that needs to be removed. So I will have another lumpectomy during which they'll test the lymph nodes as well. This surgery will be done at Adventist Hospital in Hong Kong on Sunday morning (your Saturday night). Recovery is 2-3 weeks and I expect to return to KK about a week after surgery. Following that I've been told to expect chemo and radiation, which thankfully can be done in KK.

- It's tricky for a family to go through this. It's just hard on kids to have parents not at 100%, and to have the uncertainty what follows surgery is difficult. In fun news, Cade asked "how many tissues they had to take out" ... so when I think of surgery, I just imagine the doctor making an incision, pulling out about 6 tissues, & stitching me up.

- For right now, I'm requesting prayers for our boys, Dante & Caedmon, for minimal pain/swelling, and in gratitude for the ways God has already answered so many prayers. For further support, my brother, Wayne, will be running the Marine Corps Marathon in honor of me ... people can look that up at <https://give.bcrfcure.org/wendy>.

- We're disappointed with this latest news, but what it means is that the horizon for working through this is probably about 3-6 more months. I'd hoped for 1 month and done, but what matters is following each of these steps that the doctors have outlined. All will be well in time, and we are surrounded by a loving community here at the seminary, through the ELCA, and through praying friends all around the world.

That's the news we have for now. Facebook (Flung Forth Anew) is the best place to check for updates, but I will try to send out emails as well. I don't want to inundate your mailbox!
